This list of the Canadian Coast Stations was composed by Mr. Alf Lawton. Mr. Lawton was one of the first wireless operators around Eastern Canada and was one of at least six that tried to record this history and failed, at least failed to have it published in a book, but as long as we keep copies of this history in circulation it may become better known.
